Commission Chairman Barton called the meeting of the Board of Police Commissioners to order at 4:46p.m.

Minutes

Commissioner Carveth, seconded by Commissioner Barton, made the motion to approve the minutes of the March 16, 2020 meeting. **The motion passed unanimously.**

Reports

Activity of the Department- Assistant Chief Martins discussed March and April statistics with the Commissioners. The Board was informed that in March there were 27 criminal arrests and 109 motor vehicle citations. There was 1 commercial and 1 residential burglary and 2 stolen motor vehicles. In addition, there were 33 larcenies and 54 motor vehicle accidents. There were 4,160 calls for service that generated 407 written reports. In April there were 12 criminal arrests and 26 motor vehicle citations. There was 1 commercial burglary and 4 stolen motor vehicles. In addition, there were 23 larcenies and 27 motor vehicle accidents. There were 3,847 calls for service that generated 218 written reports. Assistant Chief Martins advised that the changes in April are due to COVID-19 and emphasized the continued need for residents to lock their vehicles.



Reports (continued)

Chief Gagne reported that the Records Division took in the following revenue in March report sales \$315.55, fingerprints \$25.00, permits \$290.00, and parking tags \$50.00 for a total of \$680.55. In April, the only revenue was report sales of \$157.00 due to COVID-19.

Expenditures

Chief Gagne highlighted expenditures for March and April including, training, a polygraph exam, medical supplies, DARE supplies, a sanitizing machine and the final payment to Bismark for the cell block renovation.

Budget Balances

Chief Gagne advised that the budget is in good order, overtime is down due to vacations being cancelled.

Old Business

<u>COVID-19</u>: Chief Gagne updated the Board on the policies we have made and modified as the pandemic has progressed. Our building is closed, all employees have daily temperature checks and wear masks, Records requests are done online and officers wear three different levels of masks depending on the interaction and situation. We are also closely working with our sponsor hospital for a modified response to certain medical calls in an effort to protect our officers. The ISU detectives are working different shifts and the civilians were on a modified schedule.

FBI Computer Task Force: Detective Menga will be sworn in, in the near future and will be working at the FBI 1-2 days per week.

<u>2020-2021 Budget:</u> Chief Gagne reported that the proposed budget is online for residents to view. Our request for an officer, vehicles and the server room project were removed.

New Business

On-line training: The last training session we had scheduled was cancelled due to COVID-19. POST has offered extensions and we will be utilizing Attorney Daigle for some online training.

<u>Carport – CT Green Bank</u>: A solar company approached the Town and is proposing to add panels here and constructing a car-port which will have solar panels on it. Project is in the discussion stage.

Racial Profiling Report 2018: We received 5th place for rate of car stops (#stops/per residents). Our speeding numbers were very low, we are working with AccuCom on a data collection issue we are having.


