First Selectman Zeoli made the following announcements:

NEW BUSINESS

1. Request to conduct a Public Hearing during the June Board of Selectmen meeting regarding the Neighborhood Assistance Act application submitted by Southern CT Hebrew School Academy - *On a motion* made by Selectman Williams, seconded by Selectman Carangelo and unanimously carried, *the Board approved the request to conduct a Public Hearing during the June 9, 2022 Board of Selectmen meeting regarding the Neighborhood Assistance Act application submitted by Southern CT Hebrew School Academy.*
2. Request to conduct a Public Hearing during the June Board of Selectmen meeting regarding the Orange Town Code Chapter 350 Taxation - *On a motion* made by Selectman Carangelo, seconded by Selectman Williams, and unanimously carried, *the Board approved the request to conduct a Public Hearing during the June 9, 2022 Board of Selectmen meeting regarding the Orange Town Code Chapter 350 Taxation.*

3. **Request to remove large quantities of woodchip material at Fred Wolfe Park using LoCIP Funds** – First Selectman Zeoli met with four vendors at Fred Wolfe Park regarding the removal of woodchips. Grillo Services of Milford was the only vendor who submitted a quote of \$10 per yard, each 100-yard load will cost \$1,000. First Selectman Zeoli said there would be no more than 20 loads removed for a maximum of \$20,000. *On a motion* made by Selectman Williams, seconded by Selectman Carangelo, and unanimously carried, *the Board approved using LoCIP funds for removing up to 20 loads of woodchips for a maximum of \$20,000.*
4. **Request to allocate \$1,400,000 of American Rescue Funds towards town road paving** – *On a motion* made by Selectman Goldblatt, seconded by Selectman Williams, and unanimously carried, *the Board approved to allocate \$1,400,000 of American Rescue Funds towards town road paving.*
5. **Request to Conduct the 10th Annual Rotary Club of Orange Thanksgiving Day 5K Road Race** - *On a motion* made by Selectman Goldblatt, seconded by Selectman Carangelo, and unanimously carried, *the Board approved the request from the Rotary Club to conduct the 10th Annual Rotary Club Thanksgiving 5K Road Race and 2 mile walk on November 24, 2022, hang a banner two weeks prior to the event over Orange Center Road and to waive the rental fee for the use of HPCC.*
6. **Request to Hang a Banner for the 2022 Orange Volunteer Firemen's Carnival** – *On a motion* made by Selectman Goldblatt, seconded by Selectman Williams, and unanimously carried, *the Board approved the request from the Orange Volunteer Fire Department to hang a banner across Orange Center Road for two weeks prior to the carnival.*
7. **Vending License for July 9, 2022 Fireworks Show** – Howard Dragunoff, of Action Enterprises requested a vending license to sell novelties during the fireworks show on July 9, 2022. *On a motion* made by Selectman Williams, seconded by Selectman Carangelo, and unanimously carried, *the Board approved Howard Dragunoff's request for a vending license to sell novelties during the Fireworks Show on July 9, 2022.*
8. **Request to Hold a Block Party in the Ox Yoke Road Neighborhood** - *On a motion* made by Selectman Goldblatt, seconded by Selectman Williams, and unanimously carried, *the Board approved the request to hold a block party in the Ox Yoke Road neighborhood on Saturday September 10, 2022 with a rain date of September 11, 2022.*
9. **Town Donation Towards the July 9, 2022 Fireworks** – *On a motion* made by Selectman Goldblatt, seconded by Selectman Carangelo, and unanimously

carried, *the Board approved the Town Donation of \$20,000 towards the July 9, 2022 Fireworks.*

10. Tax Refunds for the Month of May: *On a motion* made by Selectman Williams, seconded by Selectman Shanley, and unanimously carried, *the Board approved the tax refunds in the amount of \$28,505.76 for the month of May.*

At 7:16 P.M., Selectman Okenquist made *a motion to adjourn the meeting.* Selectman Shanley seconded the motion. All voted in favor.
